[Council to Reconsider Dale Farm Traveller Eviction Plan](#) in the UK

The Dale Farm Travellers are asking for letters of support in preparation for a Nov. 11 meeting of the Basildon District Council. The Council, which has twice voted to evict the Travellers, is set to review the eviction plan.

[EPAF Presents Images of Putis at Photo Exhibition](#) in Peru

A photo exhibit of the Putis exhumation, conducted by the Peruvian Forensic Anthropology team (EPAF), opens in Lima Nov. 4. The exhibit is also scheduled to visit Washington, DC and Boulder, Colo.

[AP Takes the Srebrenica Memorial Quilt to Bosnian Diapora](#) in the US

A memorial quilt honoring victims of the 1995 Srebrenica massacre was exhibited at four events in the New York area, raising \$344 for the Srebrenica weavers.

[Digital Storytelling Project Featured at Youth Forum](#) in Kenya

A pioneering project to help disadvantaged children to use blogs was highlighted at a forum for youth and civic leaders in Nairobi, covered by the Kenyan media and featured in the October issue of UNICEF's Media Magic Digest. The project was started by AP Fellow Kristina Rosinsky.

[Wastepickers' Livelihoods Threatened at Ghazipur Landfill](#) in India

Plans for a waste-to-energy plant at one of Delhi's largest landfills could jeopardize the livelihood of more than 1,000 wastepickers who recycle at the site. The Chintan Environmental Research and Action Group, an AP partner, organized a public meeting this month on behalf of the wastepickers.
